EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO SAMACHAR PLUS

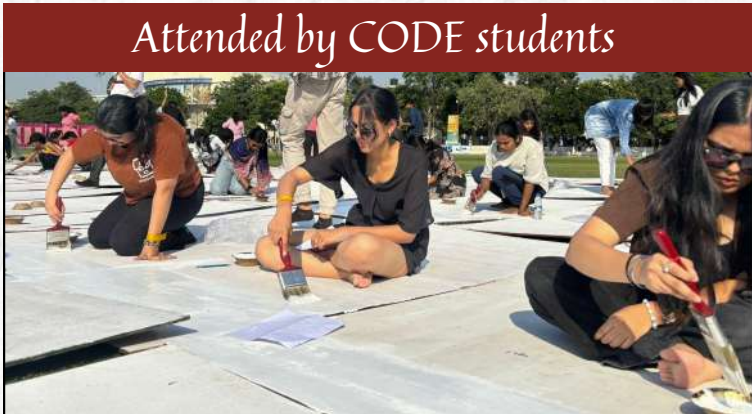

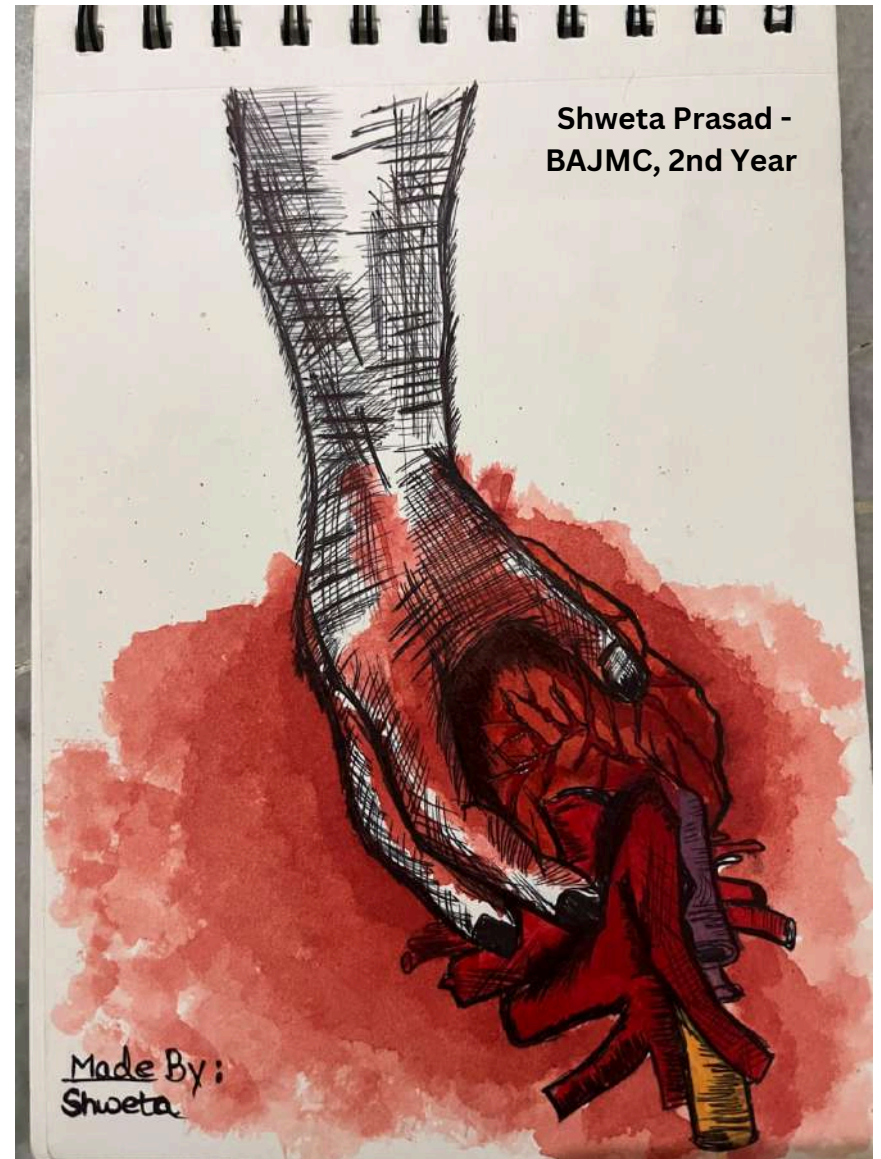
"We are so busy being busy that we forget what we are truly running for."

So take a moment today to pause. Step away from the race. Ask yourself

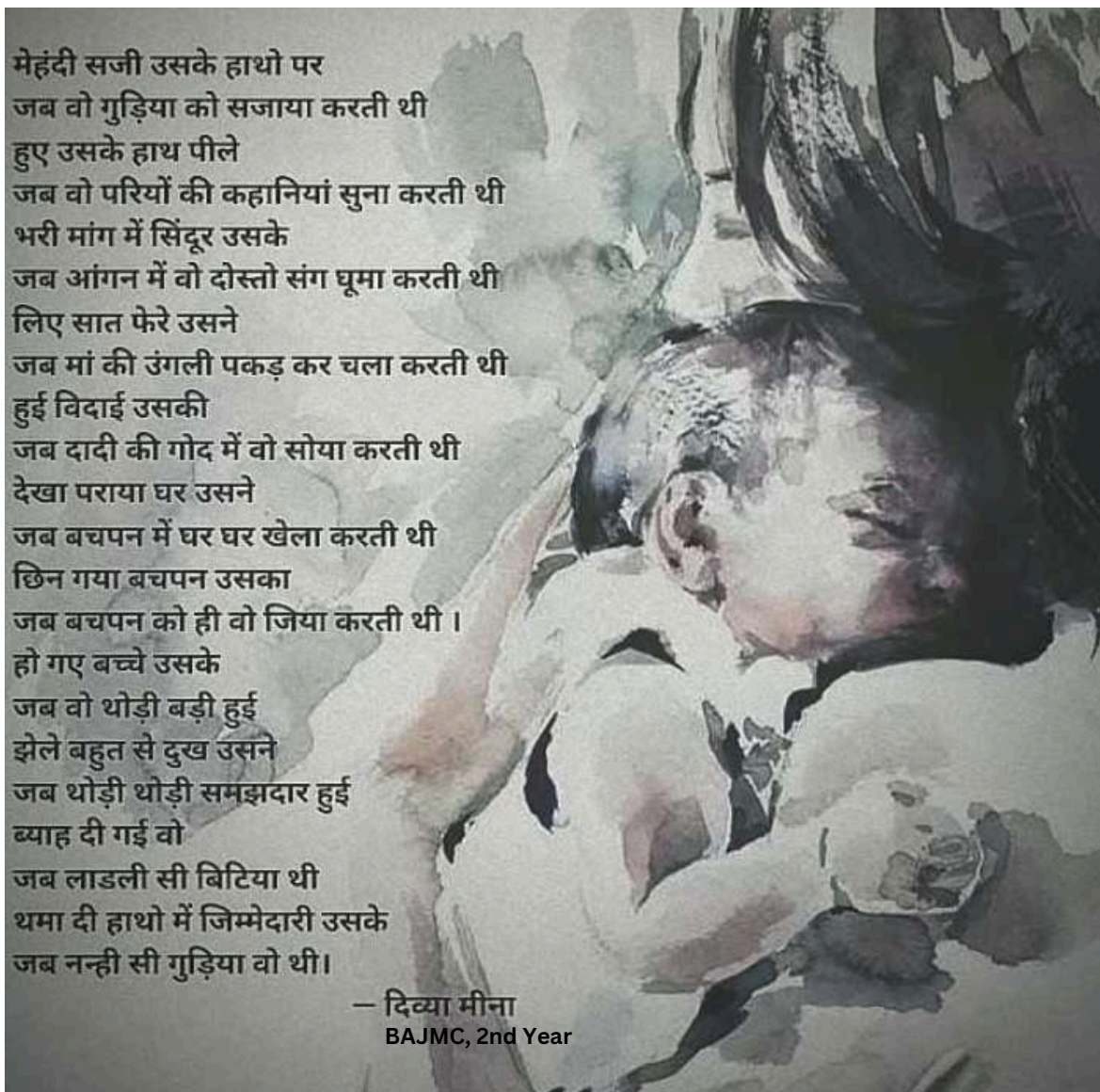
- ° Am I running towards my purpose or away from it?
